"Law & Ordinance" Insurance saves Glencoe Lodge \$10,000

The Glencoe Lodge hall was built in 1914, fourteen years before there were any building codes in the North Plains area.

Last September a driverless truck backed into the



hardware store that occupies the ground floor of the Lodge. Although the owner of the truck had insurance, after over two months it became clear that his insurance

company would only pay to replace the doors & windows to the pre-loss condition but Washington County would not allow the repairs as they would not meet current building code.

Our Lodge Chancellor Commander, Russ Sheldon, works for a company that manufactures emergency vehicles. After conversations with some of his customers and hearing tales of people and organizations having to pay thousands out of their own pockets to upgrade their building to current codes after an accident or loss Russ recommended the lodge add "Law & Ordinance" coverage. A normal policy without this coverage will only pay to repair damage and does not pay

for any code-required upgrades. "L & O" coverage pays for required upgrades associated with making covered repairs.

Five weeks before the accident, or about 0.1% of the age of the building, we voted to add this coverage. This decision turned out to be very fortuitous.



The only way to meet current code was to replace the entire storefront with aluminum framework and insulated "High E" glass. The cost for this upgrade was about \$10,000 more than the estimates to just repair the damage. Without L & O coverage the Lodge would have had to pay the extra cost to bring the storefront up to code.

Anyone who owns an older building that does not meet current building codes, energy conservation requirements or ADA access requirements should con-

remembered some of the members whose names were mentioned. The evening was enjoyable for those who attended.


Grand Chancellor's Message



It was my privilege to be able to have two speakers from Doernbecher's attend our District Conventions. Ellen Bennett spoke at District 1 Convention and is a parent of a patient at Doernbecher's who has been a patient at various times since his birth. He has had many surgeries there and is now 14 years old. Ellen shared some of her experiences with dealing with her son's problems and how much Doernbecher has done for them. She is very active in the volunteer program and is a charter member of Friends of Doernbecher and has also organized and participated in fund raisers for Doernbecher.

At District 2 Convention, **Megan Bulger from OHSU spoke to us** about how the funds we raise help the children while they are being treated. She said their average stay is about one week and they and their families are made welcome. Each patient has a room to themselves with extra beds so family members can

stay with them. Some of the activities include puzzles, arts and crafts, and birthday parties. The most favorite of

all the activities is Bingo, in fact one little patient requested that he be discharged after the Bingo session so he could attend. Megan Bulger extended an invitation to any Pythian who would like a tour of Doernbecher's to see all that they do for the children. Just contact her so she can make arrangements for you to take a tour.

Just a reminder to have your Temple Membership Chairman send in their report to the Grand Temple Membership Chairman, Rosenna Powell, PGC so she can have her report sent in to the Supreme Chief. The date that they are due is on the report. As you know our membership is shrinking. 
