Elizabeth Gloucester Lodge No. 867 adopted its name from abolitionist and philanthropist Elizabeth A. Gloucester who amassed a fortune from running more than 15 boardinghouses, including the Remsen House in Brooklyn, which drew clientele from members of New York's elite. Considered by many to be the richest black woman in America at her death at age 66 on August 9, 1883, she also raised money for New York's Colored Orphan Asylum. Find her grave at Green-Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.

Supreme Honors for NY Pythian PGC Dave Stanger recognized by Supreme Lodge


September 29, 2021




STONEWALL-JASPER LODGE NO. 6 - SOUTH CAROLINA
