# Cur Crder's 150 Anniversary\*

Commemorating the 158th Anniversary of our Order, on February 19, we recall what appeared in PI in 2013 for Pythian Awareness Week.

hroughout the Order, Lodges are planning to commemorate our 150th Anniversary, which occurs on February 19, 2014. This is a fabulous milestone which will be celebrated by our lodge at our second meeting on February 18, by 2014. This is a great moment for all Pythians. The 150th anniversary falls within Pythian Awareness Week and Presidents' Week so this event is an ideal time for recruitment of new members. A special event will be held at our Castle Hall that will be interesting and informative for all members.

On February 19, 2014, the Knights of Pythias will celebrate its 150th anniversary – the birth of the first true fraternity that celebrates the friendship of man. It was an hour in time, the morbid deaths of the war between brother states that had gone down the depths of its sorrows and was wailing loudly for someone with power to whisper to the world its holy lessons of Friendship, and lead men to Fraternity again.

Just how far the morose views of the times have advanced influenced the mind of the Founder of our Order, we cannot postulate, but it is very evident that their force must have impressed him. The Order was what the hour needed; and he proved to be the instrument for meeting this need.

The idea of an Order, having for it main purpose the inculcation of lessons of Friendship, and based upon the old story of Damon and Pythias, seems to have originated with Brother Justus Rathbone. A rough draft of the First Degree (Rank) was written by him at Eagle Harbor, Mich., in the Winter of 1860-61, but not used at the time. At Washington, D.C., in the winter of 1863-64, he made the acquaintance of J. T. K. Plant, P. S. C., and read him this Ritual. Others were taken into their confidence. On the evening of February 15, 1864, several gentlemen, members of the Orion Glee Club, met at No. 369 F Street, and decided to form a society, based on this Ritual. A committee was appointed to procure members. These were invited to meet at Temperance Hall, Washington, D. C., on Friday evening, February 19, 1864.

Upon agreement, a number of gentlemen met, and after some conversation upon the subject, they were called to order, and, upon motion of Mr. J. H. Rathbone,

a chairman of the meeting was proposed, and Mr. J. T. K. Plant was unanimously called to the chair, and D. L. Burnett nominated as Secretary. After organizing as above, the object of the meeting was stated to be the organization or foundation of a



society, its business and operations to be of a secret character, having for its ultimate object Friendship, Benevolence, and Charity. Before proceeding further, those present were requested to subscribe to an oath. All present having signified their willingness to do so, the same was administered to them by reading the oath by J. H. Rathbone. After taking the oath, on motion, it was resolved that this Order be called the KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS.

On motion that a Committee be appointed to prepare a Ritual of opening and closing a Lodge, and of the ceremony of initiation into the same, the Chair appointed Brother J. H. Rathbone as said Committee, who immediately reported a Ritual, which he had prepared, and which, upon being read, was adopted. The Lodge then went into an election of officers, which resulted with brother J. H. RATHBONE as Worthy Chancellor.

Such was the beginning of the Knights of Pythias as an organization: Few, if any, present that Friday evening, in their wildest dreams, pictured its results. Doubtless some visions of success flashed before them, some prophecies of the work they could accomplish. They may have thought that in some distant day men might rise up and call them blessed; that after they were dead, and others had taken their places, and worked out the ideas they had only dratted, their names would be as imperishable as those of Damon and Pythias; but to think that in less than seven years one hundred thousand should listen to the story of that night with gratitude in their hearts, was something too wild and too daring to dream even! But such is the reality—a reality that astonishes all calculations.
