Preserving our Heritage (Part 2)

A message from Supreme Inner Guard Bill Peal

A first order of business for members of a local lodge in addressing the task of preserving our history comes in the investigation of that history.

- What do we know about our lodge and its past accomplishments?
- How has our past involvement made a positive impact in our community and helped our fellow citizens?
- How did we organize these projects and what were our achievements?

Bringing this kind of attention to our past is a first step in organizing a plan for preserving our heritage. Our goal is to promote service to our community that will establish cooperation, friendship, and good will. Looking at the successful projects of the past years helps us gain focus on our future. In developing new projects, we need to form a committee with a chairman to direct the work and research. A plan needs to be drawn up to tell the story of our lodge and display the evidence of all our efforts and our history. Our goal is not just to display our historical objects, but also to tell our story and highlight our accomplishments.

It is our obligation to properly care for the paraphernalia that we use in conducting our lodge's meeting ceremonies. The Book of Law, the flag of our nation, the jewels of each office, the altar, and each officer's station. Our Pythian journey was established in 1864 by Justus H. Rathbone and now embraces our subordinate lodges in the United States, Canada, England, Italy, Germany, Hawaii and the Philippines, with most lodges' charters dating back to the late 1800s. This means that our meeting paraphernalia has been used for all that time. Care needs to be taken to protect it and prolong its use and value. The Book of Law may need to be rebound or repaired. Attention to all these items could be overdue. The charter of the lodge also may need to be cleaned up and/or repaired. Time may have stained or damaged the frame or glass covering the charter. This effort should be extended to our Grand and Supreme lodges to protect and preserve our great heritage. At the Supreme level great care for our book of law, the Rathbone Bible, is being conducted. It has been repaired and placed in a sealed protective cover to preserve it from the elements of time. It will be displayed in the national Pythian Museum in Weatherford, Texas for all to see.

As we look back on our founding fathers, we see a nation torn apart with anger, hatred, and revenge in the hearts of our citizens. This was the result of the fighting of our civil war.

President Lincoln responded in learning about our ritual and its teachings:

"The purposes of your organization are most wonderful. If we could but bring its spirit to all our citizenry, what a wonderful thing it would be. It breathes the spirit of Friendship, Charity and Benevolence. It is one of the best agencies conceived for the upholding of the government, honoring the flag, for the re-uniting of our brethren of the North and the South, for teaching the people to love one another, and portraying the sanctity of the home and loved ones. I would suggest that these great principles be perpetuated and that you go to the Congress of the United States and ask for a charter and so organize on a great scale throughout this Union, and disseminate this wonderful work that you have

so nobly started; I will do all in my power to assist you in this application and with your work."

After adoption of President Lincoln's suggestion, an application was made to Congress for a charter, and the Order of Knights of Pythias was the first American Order ever chartered by an Act of the Congress of the United States.

As I travel around our nation and Canada visiting subordinate lodges, I am pleased to see many great examples of restoration and display of Pythian artifacts. I have gathered good ideas and examples to draw from in this effort to protect and highlight our past. It is my hope that by sharing some of this good work we all can benefit.

The Golden Circle of Champions was founded in 2016 to raise awareness and provide funds to help local children battling pediatric cancer. Through donations and fundraising efforts, support is provided directly to the families to meet their most urgent needs.

The children selected have ranged from three months to 17 years of age and have been diagnosed with life-threatening cancer. At the Pendleton Round-Up, there is a passing of the golden boot for donations from the crowd during the rodeo performance. These families desperately need our help in facing the challenge presented by this disease.

The question now is how the Knights of Pythias can step up to the occasion and provide support to this most worthy cause. In 2025 the Oregon Foundation donated \$5,000, to support these local families in need. The Supreme foundation met the challenge with a matching donation of \$5,000 making a \$10,000 donation in total for presentation at the Supreme Bull Riding event in conjunction with the world-famous Pendleton Round-Up. This presentation was televised on the Cowboy Channel across the nation and in Canada and England. Together our efforts offer new hope to these children and their families as they work to survive the harsh realities of therapies that treat this disease. Many local families are living with the pain of watching cancer attack their child. Medicine and research are making great strides in this battle for a cure and relief of the pain inflicted. However, many of those families cannot face this challenge

alone due to inadequate finances, and it results in the helpless reality of watching their child grow weaker by the day. This is where the Golden Circle of Champions can provide a lifeline of support. With support from our organization, this good work is made possible. It is this generosity that furthers the vision of our founders and continues our mission of assisting children in need by helping them toward the path to recovery.
