visitation in the future. We have a facebook page "Grand Temple of Oregon Pythian Sisters" if you are able to look there for more information.


We should all be thinking about our up-coming installations. Please let me know who is being your installing Officers as soon as possible so I can mail the information and forms needed to them.



Ivanhoe Knights Continue Support for FRC Robotics Team

For 15 years FRC Team 1432 has been assisted by Ivanhoe Lodge to participate in the FIRST Robotics Competition. This has enabled us to assist many students who were expected to drop out of high school to graduate and most went on to college.

FRC Team 1432, the robotics team working in the basement of Ivanhoe lodge, has had a couple of challenging years because of COVID. In 2020 we were able to participate in only one of two district competitions before they were shut down due to COVID. The team ended the completion on the number 2 alliance for the finals. We had a working robot that finished 32nd in the Oregon and Washington. We had determined how to change things for our next competition so that we would end up much higher in the standings. Then they were canceled. Because of everything being shut down, we were unable to do our community outreach or our fundraising.

In 2021 there were no in-person competitions. For that year we were asked to design a game that could be



used for a future competition. The team designed an innovative and cooperative game that would use elements from the previous year's games. The team built a model game using a 3-D printer and submitted it via Zoom. It was well received by the judges.

After that there were no opportunities to do any fundraising and our sponsors were likewise restricted in their abilities to fundraise for their own programs as well. Despite all of these trials we have a committed team of students who have raised \$8,000 for the coming year's competition, but we are still \$2,000 short of being able to compete.

We only have until January 8, 2022 to raise the money. Any assistance anyone can give would be much appreciated. Ivanhoe Lodge has not been able to do any fundraising this year and Boeing was unable to help the team this year either. We recognize that fundraising has been difficult for everyone everywhere and we appreciate any help.

Memorial Tributes

Mark Erickson, PSR, PIR

December 12, 1951 - June 28, 2021

Mark lived the last eight years of his life in Milwaukie, Oregon, passing away at home on June 28, 2021. Mark had not been well for several years. Mark was born on December 12, 1951 to Roy and Bonnie Erickson. He was the youngest of two brothers and one sister. He was preceded in passing by his parents and sister.



The Pythian Family was his life. He was a member of: The Knights of Pythias, Pythian Sisters, Dramatic Order Knights of Khorassan (D.O.K.K.), and Nomads of Avrudaka. He served these organizations faithfully and received honors of: Chancellor Commander of his home lodge Ivanhoe #1, Past Grand Chancellor and Grand Secretary Domain of Oregon, Past Supreme Representative (PSR), Past Imperial Regent (PIR), and Deputy Supreme Chancellor (DSC).

Mark's father, Roy Erickson, was a great role model to him. Prior to his father's passing, Mark and his father attended Knights of Pythias meetings together. Later, after his father passed, Mark found great joy traveling to various Pythian Family events with his mother, Bonnie Erickson, before her passing.

He was preceded in passing by his parents and sister. Mark is survived by two brothers and their families.

The following tribute and photos were submitted by Mark's older brothers Neil and Gordon Erickson:

Mark was born on December 12, 1950 in Portland, Oregon to E. Roy and Bonnie Erickson joining a sister, Ellen and two brothers, Gordon and Neil. The family picture was taken in 1952.

The Erickson family lived in Portland and for a while in Spokane (1958 – 1962). While in Spokane Ellen passed away. After returning to Portland, Mark attended Roosevelt High School, where Roy had graduated in 1933. Mark graduated in 1969. Mark then attended Portland State University graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree.



Mark worked as a computer-data systems-programming consultant until 2001 when he retired. His work experience prepared him to assist with a Pythian computer workshop in 2005.

Roy seen here in a 1951 photo served as a Pythian since the 1940's was a great role model and he introduced Mark to the Pythians at an early age and Mark joined the Pythians.

Roy, Bonnie and Mark looked forward to attending Pythian events together. One was the Medford Grand Lodge in 1990 where Roy, Mark and Bonnie were attendees.

Mark loved people, especially children and youth. He loved seeing their enthusiasm and innocent smiles. Several times he wrote for the Pythian News about youth activities reminding the membership that they must be "Passionate to be a Pythian" and to focus on their community service. Mark's passion showed when he helped to serve the youth by distributing bicycle helmets.

Before and after retirement, Mark participated in as many Pythian events that he could. He loved attending them sharing the moment with fellow Pythians. Many events were in Oregon including Festivals, Banquets or in Canada at the Far West Conclave or the BC Grand or wherever in the US.

Mark also enjoyed his extended family around the Portland area and would follow many on Facebook. He would join them for Holidays, Christmas, Thanksgiving and the 4th of July and for special occasions, birthdays and anniversaries. The three Erickson brothers and their immediate families would gather together for an annual dinner when his older brother Neil and his wife would visit from California. Mark's favorite pastime was reading – he read many books and could not seem to get enough.

Mark passed away at home on June 28, 2021 from a heart attack. He was a humble man, a great role model and a devoted Pythian. Serving as a Pythian gave Mark's life meaning and a deep purpose as he lived "to promote friendship and to relieve suffering" by extending the Pythians principles of friendship, charity and benevolence.

Mark is interred in a crypt in the Terrace Colonnades Mausoleum # 3 at Lincoln memorial Park. No public memorial is planned. The family encourages contributions be sent to the Oregon Pythian Continuing Education Fund

Michael Howard Talbot Sr.

A 35-year resident of Cottage Grove, Michael Talbot passed from complications due to Agent Orange exposure.



Michael is survived by his wife Paula Ann Talbot, five children Michael Talbot II, Katrina, Francien, Fred and Velton, his mother Ruth Talbot, three brothers and a

sister, six grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, and many nephews and nieces. His father Fred V. Talbot has passed away.

Mike was born August 20,1947 in Modesto, California. He first met his wife in 1963 in high school at Ceres Union High School. They graduated together in 1965, and married in 1966. Shortly before his Marine Corps deployment to Vietnam, Michael and Paula had their first child, and they named their son after Mike to carry on his namesake.

Michael had many interests and hobbies including freelance photography, an interest and vocation he shared with Paula, to the extent of building his own darkroom to develop their photographs. Mike enjoyed riding his Honda Gold Wing motorcycle, building remote control airplanes from scratch and flying them, and science fiction novels and media.

Mike played drums and sang in Sally Duncan's band Easy Country and had a cameo in the movie, Good Luck, with Gregory Hines.

He was ranked the number two ASE certified mechanic in the country by General Motors, he was a published author of a science fiction thriller called, "Last in his Class," he was a Past Grand Chancellor of the Oregon Knights of Pythias 2017-2018, and he was an ordained minister, marrying one of his granddaughters shortly before he passed.
