McMinnville's Diana Lodge Preserves Pythian History

Diana Lodge #63, McMinnville, has formed an historical committee to address the identification and preservation of historical relics found within their own lodge. Just over a year ago, a few members, led by senior member Brad Robison, had occasion to go through back storage areas of their historic building. They soon identified aging and unprotected artifacts within unused cabinets and closets in those back areas of the lodge. Many of these items date back to the 1800s. It was clear something needed to be done to protect these times and document the history these items represent.

One particular item of great interest to these lodge Brothers was the discovery of old leather-bound minutes books, the first of which dated back to the creation of Diana Lodge in October of 1894. The names of the founding members memorialized in this relic read like a who's who of McMinnville at the time. Senior members recall stories of the lodge having a reputation for being a place where large-scale local business was discussed while enjoying lodge hospitality. This seems to be the case: many of the names on that old meeting roster can now be seen as street names in town.

Older ritual costumes were also discovered in back areas; most had been thrown into cardboard boxes, left to rot and moths. The need was clear: a committee was formed and soon devised a multi-part plan to inventory, clean, repair and seal original costumes left otherwise unprotected; to computer scan and then preserve old original lodge documents; to interview senior members, documenting their knowledge of the lodge; and to memorialize committee efforts within investigative reports and to share with members the rich history identified from these efforts.

One of the first projects of the committee was to build a lighted display case of hardwood and glass, one large enough to show some of the restored costumes and artifacts from yesteryear. With support from the board of directors, utilizing Brad Robison's craftsmanship (and garage) and the electrical expertise of Mike Sliper, the pictured display case was completed. It is now a proud addition to the lodge.

Committee members continue to meet and have an enjoyable time while continuing their research and investigation. Committee members include Ken Heininge, Historian; Brad Robison; Mike Sliper; Rob Stephenson; Larry Williams and Jeff Burgess.

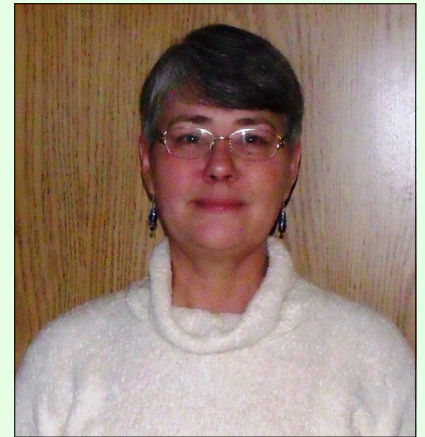

Adopt-A-Bike 2013 Wrap Up

The 4th annual Adopt-A-Bike (AAB) was different from previous AAB Projects. In previous years, certificates were given out to the children of Washington County to redeem for a bicycle package - a refurbished bicycle, a helmet, a bicycle lock, and a 2-hour bicycle skills clinic. For 2013, WashCo BTC worked with the teachers and staff of W.L. Henry Elementary to distribute bicycles to 21 deserving students. Students were selected from an essay competition, where students had to write about why they wanted a bicycle. The recipients were chosen by the staff and teachers of W.L. Henry Elementary. A presentation date was planned, and the volunteers hit the ground running in an attempt to raise the funds and the support needed to make the event a memorable one for the receiving students. On a frosty Dec. 19th, volunteers from WashCo BTC, the Hillsboro Police Department, W.L. Henry, and Poynter Middle School Bike Club gathered to give away bicycles to 21 truly excited students.



2013's AAB Project presented many serendipitous moments for volunteers, with support from local media sources giving the organization and its project much needed publicity. KPTV Fox 12 donated 20 new bicycles to the cause, giving WashCo BTC quite a lot to cheer about for the recipients at W.L. Henry Elementary. The students at Poynter Middle School Bike Club took part in the effort, giving WashCo BTC bicycles that bike club members refurbished themselves. With the funds raised and the amazing number of bicycles donated, WashCo BTC was able to donate an amazing 35 bicycles to the children of Washington County - 21 bicycles to W.L. Henry Elementary Students, 10 bicycles to Adelante Mujeres, 4 bicycles to Southminster Presbyterian Church in Beaverton.

In addition to the many personal donations made by members of the community, WashCo BTC would love to acknowledge the donations made by the **Hillsboro Knights of Pythias**, the **Nomads of Rose City**, and **Safe Kids Washington County**. We would again like to thank KPTV Fox 12 for their magnificent donation of new bicycles, the Poynter Middle School Bike Club for their hard work on refurbishing the bicycles they donated to our cause, and local news sources for helping us reach a wider readership. Remembering Jacquie Girard, PIR, PSR

Jacquie Girard

July 25, 1942 ~ February 28, 2014

Jacquie was elected Grand Chief of Oregon in 1993 and was elected Maharani of the Nomads of Avrudaka for the term 2003-2005.

Jacquie and her husband Jerry, working with the Foundation of the new Mexico Highlands University, started in the year 1999 the Robert Girard Memorial Endowed Fund for Scientific Research. The fund has grown and in October 2013 they received the prestigious Hilton Award, which is the honor given to a Non-Alumni who supports the University and its students.

Jacquie is survived by her husband, Al Jerry Girard; daughters Kimberlee K. Paggett and Kristin K. Girard; granddaughter Emily Paggett, plus 2 brothers and their families.

Since Jacquie and I both came from strong Pythian families—and—each of us went on to serve as the head of a Pythian Order, I felt we had a special bond. Jacquie was Maharani from 2003-2005 and I was Supreme Chief from 2004-2006, so we had 1 year in common as top leaders in our organizations. Our duties involved dozens of trips across the US and Canada to lead our members and spread the love and unity of our Pythian and Nomad philosophies. We developed long-lasting friendships with Pythians that we met at state and provincial meetings as well as our international conventions.

Here are some things that come to mind when I think of Jacquie:

- Jacquie's special smile. She always offered a cheery thought to try and make each day a little brighter.
- Jacquie's theme when she was Grand Chief: "Communication is the Key!" So true!
- Jacquie's courage and grace as she battled



health issues over the years. What a class act—a model for each of us to follow.

- Jacquie and Jerry's dedication to the Oregon Garden. This led Oregon Pythians to unite in a statewide fundraising project which strengthened the bond of Pythians all over Oregon. And we have the beautiful water feature as a permanent tribute for all to enjoy!

- Jacquie's care and dedication to the beautiful ritualistic work of our Orders.

These things I remember about Jacquie—a fine Pythian from a fine Pythian Family—the Murchisons. We would all do well to follow along in her footsteps as we live each day—and—work together on our Pythian projects.

Helmet Lodge—Ed Muth's 100th Birthday!

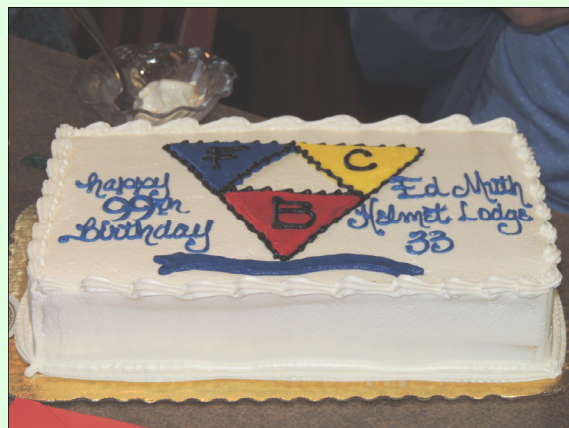

Dear Knights and Sisters,

Did everyone see that the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade was led by FIRST Robotics Teams? It wasn't us, but we were sure proud of the teams that got to go. They were the winners from the world championship. Maybe someday it will be us.

Hope you all had a great Christmas. At Ivanhoe Lodge we celebrated both Hanukkah and Christmas. In December two of our mentors spoke about our program at SE Portland Rotary's Christmas fundraiser; they mentioned the **Knights of Pythias** as well. One of our students made a working Geiger counter; then it was time for Kick Off.

Kick Off for our competition was January 4 at University of Portland. We met at the **Ivanhoe Lodge** at 5 AM. We grabbed seats as quick as we could. This year's competition has us catching and throwing large balls and trying to get them through a goal.

The next week was finals. Students are required to maintain their GPAs if they want to build on the robot so this was a very stressful week for everyone because students only have 6 weeks to design, program and build their robot.

We keep in contact with the Umatilla team we mentored 2 years ago and the team in Chile that we helped when they had their big earthquake. Both teams had very nice write ups in their local papers. You can see videos from the Chilean team on our Facebook page

Besides building our robot we had made a commitment to help plant trees in the Lents neighborhood. It lost us a day but was worth it. Lents will be better for our efforts. If you look in the background the trees were hauled to where they were being planted on a trailer pulled by a bike! There was lots of

prototyping, drilling and learning new skills.

February 10th—We were invited to attend the Portland premier of the movie Robo Cop! We were invited because of our robotics work. They asked us to bring our robot from last year to show people at the Lloyd Cinema theatre. They gave us some really nice posters and we put one on our door to the shop at **Ivanhoe Lodge**.

Competition this year is totally different from anything we have done in the last 10 years. Instead of one regional event there will be district events and a combined Oregon and Washington regional event.

Team competition season consists of two or more district events. Our 2 events were Wilsonville on March 21-22 and OSU on April 4-5. Performance at the first two district events determines which teams qualify for regional championship competition. Similarly, performance

at the regional championship determines which teams qualify for the world championship competition. (The world championship competition is in the United States.)

The game consists of two alliances competing against each other in each round. An alliance is a group of three robots playing together. Each match is 2 1/2 minutes long. The first 10 seconds of a round is called the autonomous mode where the robots operate completely on their own using a computer program written by team

members. The remaining 2 minutes and 20 seconds is called the teleoperation mode where the driver controls the robot using a joystick and a computer.

For the first day and a half of the competition, the teams cycle through multiple qualification rounds. In the qualification rounds, the alliances are randomly selected. By the end of the qualification rounds, each team will have competed an equal number of times.

At the end of the qualification rounds, teams are ranked by their win-loss-tie record. The top eight ranked teams become team captains for the eight alliances that will compete in the elimination rounds. The alliance captains get to choose from the remaining teams which teams they want on their alliance. In the elimination round, there are quarter finals, semi finals and then the final. All brackets are best two out of three.

Wilsonville was our first district event. There were a lot of issues we discovered when we got there. One was our size was too big so we had to cut our frame down, which meant our bumpers no longer fit and had to be remade. The result wasn't pretty but did allow us to compete.

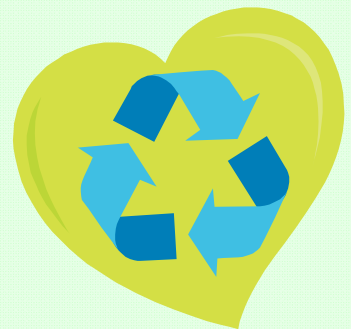
Recycling

May help to serve another or ease someone's troubled mind.

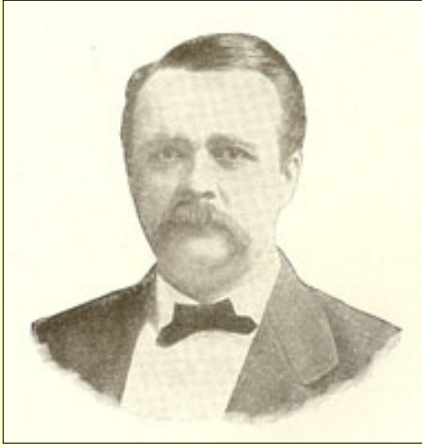
Do we really believe in our teachings? Do we mean what we say and do?

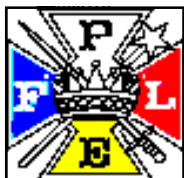

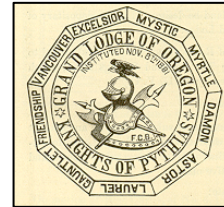
