Ivanhoe's Murchison wins Best in Class!



During the Portland Roadster Show, March 20-22, 2015 at the Portland Expo Center, **John Murchison's** 1957 E-bird took "Best in Class" for Domestic Sports Cars. This is a result of a ground-up restoration which took almost four years.

The E-bird began its life with the Murchisons when it was purchased in 1973. Although at the time of purchase, John thought it was just a regular 1957 T-bird, even though some original parts had been removed and replaced with non-original parts. The 'bird' was used for short family rides. In order to take it for a spin as a convertible, the hard top had to be physically lifted off the car and set aside. This was no easy task. Several years later John was able to



locate a soft top in California. So, taking a convertible ride became much easier.

When the restoration began research was done on the VIN number. It was discovered that John's 1957 T-bird was in fact a 1957 E-bird. Also, that it was a late production vehicle. This meant that in September of 1957 all car companies changed their model year to 1958 models. However, there were still many orders for the 1957 T-bird and Ford continued producing them until close to the end of 1957. John's E-bird was made in November 1957. Consequently, the E-bird is a 1957 model with 1958 paint colors. A very unique feature.

John is the third owner. The first owner was a doctor who special ordered it and purchased it in California. The second owner was from Washington and was sold for him by his son-in-law to John.

So, rather than be a garage ornament the 1957 E-bird has been returned to its original condition and is ready for more family rides.

Our Name: Grants Pass served as a stagecoach stop in the 1860's and became a rail head with the completion of the Oregon-California Railroad (now Southern Pacific) in 1884. The name was selected to honor General U.S. Grant's success at Vicksburg and the post office was established in 1865. Until after the turn of the century our name still retained the original spelling of Grant's Pass, using an apostrophe.




