
### **Grand Chancellor Mike's Message**

# Rose City Nomads Enjoy 4-H Wagon Train Presentation


At our May 1st Nomads meeting, **Jerry Girard** arranged for some very interesting speakers to make a special presentation.

The presenters were **Jerry Beaman, Tessah Noteboom and Heidi Weeks** of the 4-H Wagon Train organization.

This organization offers a unique summer adventure for 20-30 youth plus all of the adults (65 people total) who undertake the journey each year. As the title suggests, it is a real wagon train adventure which is held each summer here in Oregon. The trip takes about 1 week. Everyone has a job. Some people take care of the oxen, others make food. This program teaches leadership skills, outdoor skills, wagon and animal safety plus teamwork.

Tessah told us that her favorite part of the day was the end of the day, when everyone was sitting around the campfire, talking and singing. She said that two things she could improve upon were breaking in hiking boots earlier and drinking more water. Three things she thought were hard were: the ride is bumpy, communication is really important and waking up at 5am each day.

Located next to the Deschutes River, it's the ideal spot for swimming, boating, picnicking and hiking. Fly casting for brown and rainbow trout in the Deschutes River is also a favorite pastime. The campground is the perfect home base for visiting attractions in the area, including Newberry National Volcanic Monument. The park is also home to Oregon's largest ponderosa pine. Nicknamed "Big Red," the tree is 191' tall, with a circumference of 326 inches and may be in excess of 500 years old. It is also recognized as an Oregon Heritage Tree.


#### The History of the Cowboy Dinner Tree

While they are often asked about to their enrollment success, they really don't have a recruiting effort. Their members join upon being invited by those who are already committed to the organization. and who committed to maintaining a high level of integrity and character. contributions Their in community reflect that character. donating thousands of dollars every year while avoiding fanfare. It is, in fact, a source of some pride

that few people know about the organization at all, only wondering twice a month, upon seeing a steady stream of men going through the "secret door," what is going on.

What is going on? Their business meetings discuss budgetary concerns, decisions about benevolence and charity, maintenance of the historic building in which they are housed, and organization of future meetings and events. Following the meeting is a culinary feast, prepared by rotating cooking crews that include professional chefs and would-be chefs, as well as those who are just willing to help, all of whom are lodge members. The expectations are high: a spaghetti feed would result in the firing (with gentle torture) of the cooking crew, but prime rib is often on the menu. These dinners are only open to paid-up lodge members; guests may attend by special invitation of those lodge members, generally


