History of the Area::

Wallowa Lake is a small community of about 60 year-round residents, which swells to hundreds in the summer. In the 1920s, it was



a burgeoning mountain resort of cabins, an amusement park, a dance hall and bowling alley. Today the amusement park is gone, and the lodge shares the peaceful lakefront only with Wallowa Lake State Park.

The mile-long road that leads south from the lodge to where wilderness begins takes you by the Wallowa Lake Tramway, Vali's Alpine Deli and Restaurant, the Glacier Grill and General Store, and other classic, low-key mountain resort attractions.

At the north end of the lake, six miles away is Joseph, which was named after Chief Joseph, an esteemed leader of a band of the Nez Perce Tribe. Visitors come from all parts of the world to capture the history of Chief Joseph and the Nez Perce and pay their respect to the historical monument and gravesite.

When you are ready for a little culture it's time to discover the town of Joseph a place for art lovers, historians, and outdoor enthusiasts. The display of arts, galleries, unique diners, and quaint cottage stores is bound to delight you. The local artisan touch is everywhere in Joseph!

Wallowa Lake and the Wallowa River

In an alignment of perfect circumstance - climate, geology, and eons of time - converged to create the great moraines which formed Wallowa Lake 20,000 years ago. It's a special place that awes everyone who first lays eyes upon it.

Referred to as "The Crown Jewel", "The Sapphire in a Sea of Astounding Landscapes", and the "WOW of the Wallowas." Wallowa Lake has inspired passionate expression in words that for many ultimately fall short. You'll find its iconic image featured in more articles on the area because *it is the most loved destination in Northeast Oregon.*

When you drive into the Wallowa Valley for the first time, the scene is a breathtaking experience in and of itself, but it's at the end of the road where real treasure is found. This ribbon lake, with its crystal-clear, deep blue water and majestic mountain backdrop, creates yet another picture-postcard moment that few with a camera can resist. Add to that the crisp mountain air, the brilliant night sky, the emerald green valley and the warmth of its people and you have an experience that's hard to find- no matter where you travel.

And, there is an energy to this place that uplifts spirits and can even heal broken souls. Visitors often remark that being here feels like home, and for many it's an experience that's expressed in spiritual terms. Once you visit, there's no going back- a piece of your heart will always remain.

The entire area between Hells Canyon and The Eagle Cap, including Wallowa Lake, was considered in the early 90's for National Park designation. Wallowa Lake and the surrounding area is a truly magnificent place, like nowhere else on Earth

Ivanhoe Lodge Making Progress

Winter was cold for the lodge at the beginning. We had a bit of trouble with the furnace. It was putting out exhaust into the room. **Knight Hal Sullivan** and **Knight Brad Doern** discovered the chimney was blocked with probably 80 years of soot. They removed more than 20 gallons and found a scrap of partially burned paper from 1935. It has been working well ever since.

Work continues with repairs to the building – ceiling tiles have been replaced, there are new curtains, and we are looking into rainwater mitigation for the lodge. This will require coming up with an alternative to letting the rain water run into the sewer. In the process of cleaning up the office we discovered 3 magic lantern machines and hand painted glass slides that told the Pythian story and maybe a travel log. One of the mentors for the robotics team found a Pythian altar at an antiques store in

Aurora. They wanted about \$300 for it.

Ivanhoe Lodge invited the Sisters of Ivanette Temple twice to join them for one of their monthly dinner meetings. The fourth Tuesday of March the officers from the Grand Lodge joined us for our dinner meeting at Super King Buffet. We were very pleased to have the Sisters join us. We also joined the Sisters for their membership tea with an information table. There were a couple of nibbles from potential new members. We were very pleased to be invited to join the Sisters in their community event. We hope that they will do more of these and that we will be invited back.

The Lodge is still working on coming up with a fundraiser.

Portland's FRC Robotics Team

FIRST Robotics Competition Team1432 sponsored by Ivanhoe Lodge # 1 has just finished its first of 2 district competitions for the year. This year's challenge required the robot to overcome the obstacles that protect a castle - moat, draw bridge, portcullis, etc. They also needed to breech the tower through launching boulders (or in this case balls) at it. At the end of the competition there was the opportunity to try and climb the tower wall. The team scored well enough to make it to the semifinals at the Philomath competition. This has been accomplished through the hard work of the students and the purchase of distance sensors and the help of Cody Hanks programing mentor. They had 6 weeks to design, build, program, and learn to drive the robot. The team is looking forward to their second district event at Clackamas Academy of Industrial Science. Their next competition is April 1st and 2nd in Oregon City. There's a slim chance that the team will win their way into the finals of this next competition. This would be a wonderful thing and something that the team has never achieved before but if they do they will have less than one week to come up with \$6,000 to compete at the regional championship the following weekend. If you are interested in watching the regional championship the best of the best 60 teams from Oregon and Washington will compete for a chance

to go to the World championship in Chicago. The top 6 from teams both states combined will get to go. We won't even think about



what that would cost.

There was some question as to whether or not the team was going to get to compete at all this year, in fact they almost didn't. But, thanks to the generosity of the Pythian community and supporters of FRC Team 1432 they made it. It is the team's hope that they will be able to bring the robot to the Pythian Fun Days and you can all see it in action.

FRC Team 1432 would like to take this opportunity to thank all those that have supported them and especially **Chancellor Commander Alan LohKamp**, and **Knight Patrick LohKamp** for their help in making the program possible.

Professional Historian Assists McMinnville Lodge's Historic Committee

Diana Lodge #63. McMinnville, formed an historic committee a few years ago to address the identification and preservation of historic relics discovered in deep storage within their own lodge. The age of these relics promises to tell a tale of the founding of Diana Lodge, which seems to coincide with the founding of the City of McMinnville. Items of interest date back to the late 1800s and include ceremonial robes, an antique projector with slides. swords. pendants. various documents, and several leather bound minutes

books old enough to

document the very first lodge meeting and the purchase of the lodge building. Lodge members discovered many interesting facts through analysis of these relics, but soon came to realize that in order to further their understanding of the history of the lodge, consultation with others outside of their limited circle of knowledge would be necessary.

Luckily, committee efforts caught the attention of Rebecca Quandt, who is an historian with and the director of the McMinnville Downtown Association (MDA). She has become an honorary committee member of sorts. Rebecca has offered her expertise in the analysis of Diana Lodge artifacts. She is especially interested in a connection between the early histories of Diana Lodge and downtown McMinnville. There seems to be an interesting correlation and influence.

Rebecca is a professional historian who was recruited by committee member Rob Stephenson. She holds a Master of Science in Historic Preservation and Architecture from the College of Charleston / Clemson University. Rob's business office just happens to be in the same building with Rebecca's, each within the offices of the McMinnville Downtown Association. Diana Lodge is very lucky to have her assistance.

Rebecca's expertise involves the analysis of and preservation of historic artifacts. Certainly the most valuable piece of evidence to committee members are those beautiful hand written minutes books; there are several of them, one dating back to 1894. Rebecca has a well-trained eye for reading the elegant cursive writing from yesteryear. She took possession of a couple of the lodge's oldest books for the purpose of transcribing cursive writing in the books into text documents for easier

Each historic committee member seems to have their own special area of interest. Trustee Brad Robison, for example, took special interest in the ceremonial robes. Brad writes: "The Diana lodge of McMinnville has been fortunate to have many uniforms (costumes) from our past. Our Historic Committee decided in January of 2013 to have 8 of the best preserved

uniforms, crowns and head gear cleaned and repaired as needed. They are stored in archival coverings, clean and dry. The Committee, with Board approval, then built by hand an oak and glass lighted display cabinet for the uniforms and assorted other historic items to be seen in our lodge hall. These items on display may be well over 100 years old and in remarkable condition. If you look closely you can see that they were made with very top of the line materials as well as being well made. Along with the eight preserved uniforms. our lodge has approximately

eighty other costumes in various condition in storage, not to mention the swords, armament, helmets, wigs and many other artifacts from the era of when these items were in use."

Prior to building a display case for these antique costumes, the lodge acquired a large glass display cabinet to protect some of the other relics. Presently included in this display case is a "black ball" style voting box, an antique slide projector and slides, which was likely used for initiation ceremonies, an old uniform catalog, and many other items likely used for lodge ritual. The historic committee has made a point of interviewing the lodge's oldest members, hoping to find a knight who can recall the use of these robes and ceremonial items. To date, no living member interviewed is old enough to have been around when these items were used. This further indicates a need for researchers to look outside the lodge for answers.

The board of directors of Diana Lodge has considered the possibility of hosting an open house event one day in the future. The purpose of this event would be to give interested lodge brothers from other lodges a chance to come view all of the lodge's antique robes, documents and ceremonial relics for themselves. The Historic Committee would appreciate this as a possible opportunity to attract persons with advanced interest, knowledge and expertise in our fraternal order, who could possibly give context to many of these relics.

Committee members continue to meet and have an enjoyable time while continuing their research and investigation. Committee members include Ken Heininge, Historian; Brad Robison; Mike Sliper; Rob Stephenson; Larry Williams and Jeff Burgess.


Phoenix Lodge Supports Their Community




