Dear Sisters and Brothers,



Grand Secretary's Charlie's Report


It has been a busy time for me since my last report.

Fern Temple Awards 6 Scholarships

Fern Temple awarded five \$500 scholarships this year. Two for Yamhill-Carlton seniors, **Shane Davis**, planning to attend Corbin University Salem, Oregon. Majoring in Physical Education and a minor in youth ministry. Shane is a 4 year varsity cross country and track, going to state 3 times in 800m.

Jasper Morrison, will be attending Oregon State University studying electrical engineering. Jasper also participated in cross country and track, and volunteered at the St Barnabas soup kitchen in McMinnville.

Ashley and Nathan Van De Walle and Paul Myers had their scholarships renewed.

Fern also voted to support the fund raiser for the new Ag building fund and donated \$700 to that project. The school district cut the funding for the Ag building due to many bumps in the road they are currently working to get back with in budget. With support from the school board, a grass roots group got together to make sure the Ag program had a shop building, with a goal of \$250,000.

Community support has been making this possible. The Y-C FFA Alumni Association is a 501-C3 organization and will issue tax deductible receipts for all donations. Anyone wishing to donate can send a check to Y-C FFA Alumni Association, PO Box 205, Yamhill, Or 97148 with "New Ag Building" on the memo line. A donor wall is planned to help recognize those who helped make this project possible. For the future of our kids

Yamhill Carlton FFA program has the first vineyard learning center in the US. They planted 1.5 acres of grapes and harvested the first crop in 2014. **Ken Wright** produced the wine, the kids learned to plant and tend the vines supported by the local AVA and Chemeketa CC. The wine is sold and the money goes into the vineyard fund and the FFA Alumni fund to support the kids projects, travel to contests and conventions plus scholarships The FFA Alumni Assoc. Was started to support the FFA program and help provide funds to the kids and their projects anyone can join you don't need to have been in FFA as a student, girls weren't allowed in Ag lasses when I was in high school, my two sons were in FFA and Three of my Grand kids, Hanna is the new President for the coming year As you can see I am a big supporter of this program.
















Fern Temple Hosts GC Maureen Visit






