As we drove up the driveway, I could see why they call the home the castle on the hill.

The Texas Sisters had a nice session and took care of all business. After the meeting Kristin Watson, the homes Marketing Coordinator, Grand Junior of Texas Grand Temple, gave me a tour of the home. And was I impressed with the activities that the home has to offer.

Kristin went on to tell me that in 2019, the movie "12 Mighty Orphan's" was filmed at the home. The movie is based on a true story that took place during the great depression. The orphans lived at the Fort Worth Masonic Orphanage. As the orphanage closed in 2005, the Texas Pythian Home was chosen to be used in the film. The two main characters are Martin Sheen as Doc. Luke Wilson was the teacher/coach Rusty Russell. Rusty made these boys into football players. Most of the boys had never seen a football or knew what football was. Rusty Russell is the legendary coach who took this team into 4 state championships, over his years at the home. They came close but never won a championship.

The team was small and played against teams from bigger schools and the player were always bigger than the boys. The equipment they used was old hand me downs, but they were proud to wear the uniforms.

This movie depicts the hardships this team and folks faced during the depression. At the end of movie, it tells about the players and what they went on to do in life.

I was honored to attend the movie while in Texas, thanks to the Nacogdoches Lodge who purchased the tickets for us. Thank you, we enjoyed the movie and since has read the book.

Martin Sheen wear a Pythian Knights watch fob in the film. During the filming Martin would take a nap in one of the guest rooms. Martin Sheen has been on several T.V. shows since the movie came out and has mention the Pythian Home.

The Texas Pythian Home for children is funded by donations and contributions, there is no government funding. The Texas Pythian Home, provides a safe, stable environment for the foster children at the home and is the first priority. The children attend the local school. If you are ever near Weatherford, I strongly advise you to make arrangements to visit the home. There is one room as a Pythian Sister Museum on the second floor. Some of the furniture used at the home dates to its early days.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

On Friday, June 11, 2021, following their annual Grand Lodge convention in Mineral Wells TX, a group of some 20 Texas Pythian Knights and Pythian Sisters were treated to a first showing of the new movie "The Twelve Mighty Orphans" in Weatherford TX. The film was produced in 2019 using the property of the Knights of Pythias Texas Home for Children, as its setting; the appearance of the Home was turned back to as it might have looked in the 1930's. The Home and its environs appear prominently throughout the movie.

The movie is about legendary Texas football Harvey "Rusty" Russell and his late 1930's journey with twelve "throw-away" orphan boys at the Texas Masonic Home for Children in Ft Worth Texas, turning them into a "brotherhood of men" high school football team that became a national treasure during the Great Depression. Based on a true story, biographic sketches for the coach and players are shown at the end of the film.

The movie was released in June 2021 for national showing. It is an exceptional fine movie. Texas Pythians, Pythian Sisters and Pythian Home Staff members are proud to have been a played a part in its production.

DELPHIA LODGE #2 DOMAIN OF WASHINGTON TOUR OF OLD KOP CEMETERY IN ROSLYN, WASHINGTON FOLLOWED BY HISTORICAL TOUR OF TOWN



Eleven (11) members joined us for our trip to Roslyn Cemetery, which is east of the Cascade Mountains from the Puget Sound Area. We met our guide David Franklin there. CC Jeff Craig had made previous arrangements to have a guide for touring both the Cemetery and the city of Roslyn. Our guide provided many stories of the early days of Roslyn, when it was a coal mining town for the railroad. There were many family tragedies back in the day, from losing 42 men at one time in the mines, to children dying from the many diseases of the day.

Following the Cemetery tour, we traveled into town and got a unique history lesson of Roslyn. The railroad advertised jobs in far-flung countries of the world. Many men and women made the journey from Europe to Roslyn to work in the coal mines. We learned about the attempts to bring in strike-breaking Afro-Americans to work in the mines following a job strike. After the strike was over, most of the men brought in drifted away from Roslyn as the miners made life uncomfortable for them. We got a tour of the company store and an explanation of its importance in a company owned town.

We finished up with lunch in Roslyn. Everyone I talked with had a great time. We are planning on participating in the next work party to assist with maintaining the KOP gravesites
